Evidence

Black Death was that everyday life changed.

Explain

For example, people's diet improved. This was because <sup>they</sup> ate more meat and dairy instead of only crops and grain. This was because farming was more animal-based due to there being fewer farmers. This was a positive consequence because people became healthier. It was also a long-time change because we still have meat and dairy in our diet.

Point: Another consequence was that the Black Death tore families apart, leaving children as orphans.  
 Evidence: For example, families were affected. This meant that orphans had no one to care for and couldn't be cared for and that most of them had to live off the streets. This was a <sup>negative</sup> bad consequence because most of the orphans didn't survive for long - possibly... It would be negative for them even if they did survive.

 A consequence of the Black Death showed that village or destroyed the environments. For example some villages were completely abandoned or destroyed. This was because when the Statute of Labourers was around people refused to pay. This meant that knights came to destroy towns. Another reason villages and towns were destroyed was because the entire population had died out. This was a positive and a negative consequence at the same time because <sup>when</sup> the buildings fell, it gave a chance for trees to grow.
